UPDATE ON THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK IN UGANDA

20th April, 2020- The Ministry of Health confirms two COVID -19 positive cases: one (1) case from 929 samples tested from truck drivers at border points of entry and one (1) from 248 samples taken from the community and quarantine centres. A total of 1,177 samples were tested today at the Uganda Virus Research Institute (UVRI). The total number of confirmed COVID-19 cases now is 58 (This includes the 2 Kenyans truck drivers who are currently being treated in Uganda).

The International Health Regulations (IHR) requires that every case that is tested and confirmed for a particular disease should be registered as the host country's case. It is therefore against the background that Uganda will capture all COVID-19 positive foreigners including truck drivers as part of her confirmed cases and treated in Uganda.

To-date, 5 truck drivers (1 Ugandan, 1 Tanzanian and 3 Kenyans) have tested positive for COVID-19. Out of these, 2 truck drivers (1 Tanzanian and 1 Kenyan)

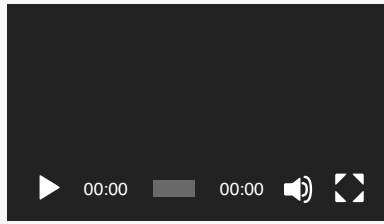

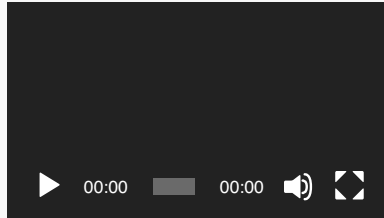

PRESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES TO MANAGE THE SPREAD OF CORONAVIRUS
Effective 1st April 2020

SUSPENDED

- Movements in and out of country: 30 DAYS
- Public Transport: 14 DAYS
- Private Transport: 14 DAYS
- Buses: 14 DAYS
- Cabarets: 14 DAYS
- Buses: 14 DAYS
- Air Transport: 30 DAYS

CLOSED

- Shopping Malls: 14 DAYS
- Academies: 14 DAYS
- Hardware shops: 14 DAYS
- Bookshops: 14 DAYS
- Non-Food Stores: 14 DAYS
- Non-Food Markets: 30 DAYS
- Garages: 14 DAYS

PROHIBITED

- Gatherings of more than 5 people
- Parties
- Bars
- Ceremonial weddings
- Churches
- Political rallies and events
- Movements of any form between 7:00pm and 6:30am

ALLOWED (WITH PRECAUTION)

- Food markets - 4 metres circumferential distance, workers should stay at camp
- Supermarkets - Regulate numbers that come and leave
- Construction sites - workers must stay at camp
- Factories - workers must wear:
- Pharmacies
- Hair shops
- Hair salons
- Barber
- Beauty
- Media houses
- Private security companies
- Garbage collection services
- Fuel stations
- Motor departments
- SCCA staff
- Telecommunication
- Door-to-door delivery
- Cleaning services
- Medical centres
- Agriculture

FOOD

- Government will provide food for those affected

BUSINESS

- URA shall not close businesses on account of not paying taxes in those 14 days.
- Cargo transport must continue
- No stopping properties due to non loan payments

GOVT WORKERS

- Day Work
- Army, the Police, the Health workers, the Electricity, Water and Telephone workers allowed
- People in barracks should not get out.

CURFEW
7:00pm - 6:30am

SECURITY & HEALTH

- The vehicles of the Army, Police, well-known officials' vehicles, Pilgrims, UWA, etc. will continue to move on orders of the competent authorities
- Government cars to help deliver people to hospitals
