

## Daily summary

Individuals who have received a first dose of COVID-19 vaccine\* **1,204,101**

Individuals who have received a two dose course of COVID-19 vaccine\* **318,976**

\*These figures are a daily cumulative snapshot of vaccinations given and recorded electronically as at 22:00 yesterday. Data entry will be incomplete at time of this daily report and the number of people vaccinated will be higher than these totals. Ongoing data entry will feed through into future updates. The data in this table are deduplicated so that people should not be 'double-counted', even if they appear in multiple priority groups.

Uptake figures now exclude data on those who have died from any cause. This planned development was applied retrospectively on 02/03/21 and has resulted in 'one-off' increases in uptake in older age groups and in care home residents, as a result of cumulative data changes since reporting began in December 2020. This provides a more accurate picture of vaccination coverage in the current Wales resident population.

The figures for care home residents, age-groups and clinical risk groups only include people who are recorded as Wales residents. The figures for care home staff, health care workers and social care workers may include people who work in Wales, but live elsewhere. Figures for care home residents and care home workers are based on care homes for older adults. Figures for adults aged 16 to 65 years in an at-risk group do not include Clinically Extremely Vulnerable adults, data collection and collation for this group is still underway and there may be changes to the reported group size.

The groups in each line of the table are not mutually exclusive and people may appear in more than one. For example, people aged 80 years and older who live in a care home will appear in the rows for "80 years and older" and "Care home residents". All data presented in this table come from the Welsh Immunisation System (WIS). The data undergo continuing quality assurance and as a result there may be fluctuations on a day to day basis in group size totals and coverage. Following data quality improvement work, the numbers of people classified as care home workers has changed compared to figures presented before 26th February. Not all data fields within WIS are complete for everyone and there will be a number of individuals who cannot currently be classified into priority groups 1 to 9. These individuals are allocated into their appropriate group totals as data completeness improves. The national Group Size figure for social care workers is not available, an estimate for percentage coverage in this group will be added to this table shortly. All data presented here are a provisional snapshot of activity and will be subject to future revision.

## Weekly summary

The below weekly summary shows total doses of Coronavirus vaccine administered by health board, and is updated every Thursday.

As at the week ending 14 March 2021, a total of **1,393,792** doses of COVID-19 vaccine were given in Wales and recorded in the COVID-19 Welsh Immunisation System.

Of the 1,393,792 doses given nationally, **1,128,823** were first doses and **264,969** were second doses.

Data entry at time of reporting will be incomplete and the number of people actually vaccinated will be higher. The figures below represent a weekly snapshot in activity recorded electronically. Ongoing data entry for vaccinations already given will feed through into future weekly updates.

Data presented here give numbers of vaccinations given in Wales and recorded electronically, the actual numbers of vaccinations given will be higher due to ongoing data entry. The figure in the first table above includes 17,417 people who received their vaccination in Wales, but who were resident outside of Wales.
