The figures for care home staff, health care workers and social care workers may include people who work in Wales, but live elsewhere. Weekly summary

Due a technical issue that is currently being resolved, the weekly vaccination report is delayed. The below weekly summary shows total doses of Coronavirus vaccine administered by health board, and is updated every Thursday.

As at the week ending 14 March 2021, a total of 1,393,792 doses of COVID-19 vaccine were given in Wales and recorded in the COVID-19 Welsh Immunisation System.

Of the 1,393,792 doses given nationally, 1,128,823 were first doses and 264,969 were second doses.

Data entry at time of reporting will be incomplete and the number of people actually vaccinated will be higher. The figures below represent a weekly snapshot in activity recorded electronically. Ongoing data entry for vaccinations already given will feed through into future weekly updates.
