As at the week ending 09 May 2021, a total of **2,786,843** doses of COVID-19 vaccine were given in Wales and recorded in the COVID-19 Welsh Immunisation System.

Of the 2,786,843 doses given nationally, 1,936,787 were first doses and 850,056 were second doses
