


Guam COVID-19 Situation Report - 175 March 12-October 26, 2020


Summary

As of October 26, 2020, there have been 4,336 cases of COVID-19 reported on Guam. One hundred and ninety-five (195) new cases of COVID-19 were reported to DPHSS from October 23–25: 187 confirmed cases and 8 probable cases. Eighty-seven (87) cases were reported on October 23, 92 on October 24, and 16 on October 25. Six COVID-19 cases were reported deceased since the last report: 2 on 10/24, 1 on 10/25, and 3 on 10/26.

New confirmed cases reported today: 82 cases tested positive at GPHL, 50 tested positive at DLS, 21 tested positive at AMC, 13 tested positive at GMHA, 11 tested positive at GRMC, six tested positive at DoD, two tested positive at Guam Medical Care, and two tested positive at Guam Radiology Consultants.

New probable cases reported today: eight cases tested positive by antigen testing: six at ExpressCare and two at IHP.


Twenty (20) cases were identified through contact tracing. One case reported recent travel from the US and was identified in quarantine. One hundred (100) cases were reported released from isolation.





Number of cases in active isolation, cases not in isolation, and COVID-19 deaths, Guam









† Criteria for release from isolation

For persons with mild to moderate illness who are not severely immunocompromised:

7-day rolling average of confirmed cases

For persons having symptoms: At least 3 days have passed since recovery defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) and any other symptoms attributed to COVID-19 AND at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared—or since recurrent symptoms appeared—AND at least 10 days have passed since the date of their first (or most recent) positive COVID-19 diagnostic test.

7-day rolling average of positive tests as a percentage of tests

For persons without symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since the date of their first (or most recent) positive COVID-19 diagnostic test assuming they have not subsequently developed symptoms since their positive test.

For persons with severe to critical illness or who are severely immunocompromised:

For persons having symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared, up to 20 days.

For persons without symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since the date of their first positive COVID-19 diagnostic test, up to 20 days.
