
Summary

As of November 9, 2020, there have been 5,473 cases of COVID-19 reported on Guam. Three hundred and ninety-six (396) new cases of COVID-19 were reported to DPHSS from November 6-8: 377 confirmed cases and 19 probable cases. Fifty-eight (58) cases were reported on November 6, 148 on November 7, and 190 on November 8. Two COVID-19 cases were reported deceased since the last report: one on 11/7 and one on 11/9.

New confirmed cases reported today: 334 cases tested positive at GPHL, 14 tested positive at AMC, 10 tested positive at DLS, seven tested positive at GMHA, five tested positive at DoD, four tested positive at GRMC, two tested positive at Guam Radiology Consultants, and one tested positive at One Love Pediatrics.

New probable cases reported today: 19 cases tested positive by antigen testing: 16 at Central Medical Clinic, two at ExpressCare and one at IHP.


One hundred and thirty-five (135) cases were identified through contact tracing. Clusters in congregate living settings were identified. Seven cases reported recent travel from the US and were identified in quarantine. Two hundred and fifty-one (251) cases were reported released from isolation.







† Criteria for release from isolation

For persons with mild to moderate illness who are not severely immunocompromised:

7-day rolling average of confirmed cases

For persons having symptoms: At least 3 days have passed since recovery defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) and any other symptoms attributed to COVID-19 AND at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared—or since recurrent symptoms appeared—AND at least 10 days have passed since the date of their first (or most recent) positive COVID-19 diagnostic test.

7-day rolling average of positive tests as a percentage of tests

For persons without symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since the date of their first (or most recent) positive COVID-19 diagnostic test assuming they have not subsequently developed symptoms since their positive test.

For persons with severe to critical illness or who are severely immunocompromised:

For persons having symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared, up to 20 days.

For persons without symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since the date of their first positive COVID-19 diagnostic test, up to 20 days.
