

KDHE has two processes for verifying COVID-19 related deaths. Notifications of deaths in COVID-19 patients may be reported directly to KDHE by local health departments or providers and are marked in our disease surveillance system. When the death certificate is received by the KDHE Office of Vital Statistics, we verify the cause of death and date of death in our surveillance system. In the second process, we repairly review COVID-19 deaths in the death registration system and update any COVID-19 deaths missing in the surveillance system, in both processes, the death certificate data is the final source of data. Therefore, the number of deaths reported here by date of death may not match the total number of deaths reported if the date of death has not been verified yet from the death certificate.
