

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Situation Report

Palau Ministry of Health - External Situation Report 13 January 2021 - 09:00 PWT

GLOBAL SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is closely monitoring an ongoing pandemic of a coronavirus disease which is affecting over 190 countries globally. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on January 30, 2020, designated its official name as Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) on February 11, 2020, and characterized it as a *pandemic* on March 12, 2020.

As of January 13, 2021:

- At least 91,383,544* confirmed cases of COVID-19 globally, including 7,429** in Guam, 128 in the Northern Mariana Is. (CNMI), 4 in the Marshall Islands, 23,856 in Hawaii, 491,258 in Philippines, 298,419 in Japan, 838 in Taiwan.
- 1,956,752* deaths reported globally 124** deaths on Guam, 308 in Hawaii, 2 in CNMI, 9,554 in Philippines, 3,962 in Japan, 7 in Taiwan.
- **50,537,895*** people have **recovered** from COVID-19 globally.

PALAU READINESS AND RESPONSE

As of January 13, 2021:

- There are **NO SUSPECTED** or **CONFIRMED CASES** of COVID-19 in Palau.
- **COVID-19 Vaccination (since Jan. 3, 2021): 725** 1st dose administered; **0** 2nd dose administered; **0** total persons vaccinated (1st + 2nd dose).
- Isolation & Quarantine:
- <u>Currently in Isolation & Quarantine:</u> **0** in quarantine facility, **0** in self-monitoring, **0** in BNH isolation, **0** in alternative care and isolation site
- <u>Total since Apr. 17, 2020:</u> 0 isolated, 927 quarantined (inbound travellers and PUIs)
- COVID-19 Testing (since Apr. 14, 2020): 3,413 tests conducted, 0 positive, 3,413 negative, 0 pending results.
- International Points of Entry Screening:
- Total since Jan. 23, 2020: 194 flights screened, 15,685 travelers; 97 vessels screened, 2,668 travelers; 913 secondary screening
- Belau National Hospital Ventilators: 0 in use, 30 total capacity 5 portable, 2 pediatric, 18 adult vents, 5 in calibration General Updates:
- MOH Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated on Jan. 22, 2020 to implement preparedness and response measures to minimize the risk of importation and potential local transmission of COVID-19 to Palau.
- MOH issued a Certification of an Unavoidable Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 on Mar. 17, 2020.
- MOH issued Directive No. 211-20 effective on November 12, 2020 re-authorizing Belau National Hospital and Public Health Measures in response to COVID-19.
- MOH received initial 2,800 doses of Moderna COVID-19 vaccines on Jan. 2, 2021 and commenced mass vaccination efforts on Jan. 3, 2021 following priority group targeting.
- MOH issued Directive No. 1-21 on Jan. 3, 2021 re-authorizing isolation and guarantine measures for COVID-19.
- As COVID-19 mass vaccination is ongoing, the public is urged to continue practicing the following measures to prevent respiratory infections:
- Frequent handwashing with soap and water or hand rub with 70% alcohol-based sanitizer.
- Respiratory Etiquettes: Cover cough and sneeze with clean tissue or shirt sleeve,
- Avoid close contact with sick people and stay away from others if you are sick. Call your doctor or hospital for advise,
- Clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces/objects.
