

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Situation Report

GLOBAL SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is closely monitoring an ongoing pandemic of a coronavirus disease which is affecting over 190 countries globally. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on January 30, 2020, designated its official name as Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) on February 11, 2020, and characterized it as a *pandemic* on March 12, 2020.

As of February 17, 2021:

- At least 109,475,012* confirmed cases of COVID-19 globally, including 7,701** in Guam, 135 in the Northern Mariana Is. (CNMI), 4 in the Marshall Islands, 1 in the FSM, 27,105 in Hawaii, 552,246 in Philippines, 418,424 in Japan, 937 in Taiwan.
- 2,416,903* deaths reported globally 130** deaths on Guam, 425 in Hawaii, 2 in CNMI, 11,524 in Philippines, 7,139 in Japan, 9 in Taiwan.
- 61,549,392* people have recovered from COVID-19 globally.

PALAU READINESS AND RESPONSE

As of February 17, 2021:

- There are NO SUSPECTED or CONFIRMED CASES of COVID-19 in Palau.
- **COVID-19 Vaccination (since Jan. 3, 2021): 3,111** 1st dose administered; **1,903** 2nd dose administered; **1,903** total persons fully vaccinated (2 doses); **11%** of population fully vaccinated (estimated 18,000 total population)
- Isolation & Quarantine:
- <u>Currently in Isolation & Quarantine:</u>
 25 in quarantine facility, 4 in self-monitoring, 0 in BNH isolation, 0 in alternative care and isolation site
- o Total since Apr. 17, 2020: 0 isolated, 1,021 guarantined (inbound travellers and PUIs)
- COVID-19 Testing (since Apr. 14, 2020): 3,742 tests conducted, 0 positive, 3,742 negative, 0 pending results.
- International Points of Entry Screening:
- Total since Jan. 23, 2020: 205 flights screened, 15,803 travelers; 104 vessels screened, 2,807 travelers; 1,031 secondary screening
- Belau National Hospital Ventilators: 0 in use, 30 total capacity: 5 portable, 2 pediatric, 18 adult vents, 5 in calibration General Updates:
- MOH Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated on Jan. 22, 2020 to implement preparedness and response measures to minimize the risk of importation and potential local transmission of COVID-19 to Palau.
- MOH issued a Certification of an Unavoidable Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 on Mar. 17, 2020.
- MOH issued Directive No. 10-21 effective on February 12, 2021 re-authorizing Belau National Hospital and Public Health Measures in response to COVID-19.
- MOH received 3rd batch of Moderna COVID-19 vaccines (3,200 doses) on Feb. 11, 2021. Mass vaccination commenced on Jan. 3, 2021 and is ongoing with targeted priority groups.
- MOH issued Directive No. 1-21 on Jan. 3, 2021 re-authorizing isolation and quarantine measures for COVID-19.
- As COVID-19 mass vaccination is ongoing, the public is urged to continue practicing the following measures to prevent respiratory infections:
- o Frequent handwashing with soap and water or hand rub with 70% alcohol-based sanitizer.
- Respiratory Etiquettes: Cover cough and sneeze with clean tissue or shirt sleeve.
- Avoid close contact with sick people and stay away from others if you are sick. Call your doctor or hospital for advise.
- Clean/disinfect frequently touched surfaces/objects.
