COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard – New Schedule for Updates

You can get more up-to-date information on the <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard</u> starting tomorrow. This week, it will be updated on Tuesday and on Friday, and beginning the following week it will be updated daily.

The dashboard provides the number of people who have been vaccinated and the total doses administered. See data by county, age, race/ethnicity and sex. Read the notes below the dashboard to learn more.

CDC officials cited the investigation findings when it updated the definition of what is considered to be a <u>close</u> <u>contact</u> in October.

Probable Cases: As of January 4, the number of COVID-19 deaths in Vermont now includes deaths among people who were considered probable cases since September 6, 2020. The impact on the total death count is minimal. Four probable deaths have been identified since September 6.

A death among a probable case is a person who:

- meets the <u>probable case definition</u> and has COVID-19 listed as a cause or contributing condition on their death certificate or
- has COVID-19 listed as a cause or contributing condition on their death certificate.
