For the Public

Please take steps to protect yourself. The ADH recommends:

- Stay home if you are sick, except to get medical care. If you think you have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop a fever, cough, or shortness of breath, call your health care provider. Your physician will decide if testing is necessary based on your symptoms and known exposures.

The chart displays the progression of COVID-19 cases in the Netherlands. The x-axis represents dates from March 17 to April 10, 2020. The y-axis represents the number of cases, ranging from 0 to 4,000. Red bars indicate daily new cases, while the solid blue line shows the cumulative total. The dotted blue line represents the expected cumulative total. The actual cumulative cases (solid blue line) are consistently higher than the expected cumulative cases (dotted blue line), indicating a faster-than-expected spread of the virus.
