

MARCH 22, 2020

State health department amends 'social distancing' public health order. State provides further guidance on public health orders.

DENVER, March 21, 2020: The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) amended its statewide public health order on social distancing.

MARCH 21, 2020

State health department provides guidance to those with COVID-19 symptoms including when to call health care providers and 911

With the increased concern over COVID-19, people are calling 911 for reasons other than a medical emergency, including asking for general information about COVID-19. People should call 911 ONLY with a medical emergency.

MARCH 20, 2020

State health department closes in-person vital record services. Phone and online services still available

People seeking certified copies of birth and death certificates can continue to submit their orders online or over the phone. Those who need to submit a request to correct/amend a birth or death record must submit their request via mail. All certified copies that are requested will be mailed. The public will not be able to pick up records until further notified.
