**PHYSICIANS' ALERT ON COMMERCIAL TESTING FOR COVID-19 AVAILABLE
THROUGH DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY SERVICES (DLS)
via
DPHSS Health Professional Licensing Office (HPLO)**

Effective March 31, 2020, commercial testing will be available through Diagnostic Laboratory Services (DLS). Health care providers can now refer specimens from patients who do not meet the criteria for priority group testing directly to Diagnostic Laboratory Services (DLS).

COVID-19 testing is covered under MEDICARE, MEDICAID, and MIP. If you have mild illness and want to be tested, contact your health care provider.

**GUAM PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY (GPHL) COVID-19 Testing remains
limited to these Priority Groups:**

1. Hospitalized and Emergency Room patients **with** COVID-19 symptoms.
2. Patients scheduled for urgent surgery (*not* elective surgery).
3. People with chronic diseases at any age **and** COVID-19 symptoms (e.g., diabetes, cancer, COPD, asthma, ERSD, lupus, cancer, and others as determined by clinician).
4. Health care workers and first responders **with** COVID-19 symptoms.
5. Older people, pregnant women and very small infants **with** COVID-19 symptoms.
6. Indigent patients **with** COVID-19 symptoms lacking insurance.

Please swab priority patients and forward specimens to the GPHL accordingly.

Coughing & sneezing



Close personal contact, such as touching or shaking hands



Touching a contaminated object or surface & then touching your face

How can I protect myself and our community?

- GREET OTHERS WITH A SHAKA instead of a handshake, hug, or kiss 
- WASH YOUR HANDS OFTEN & after touching public surfaces
- WASH HANDS WITH SOAP & WATER FOR 20+ SECONDS or use hand sanitizer with over 60% alcohol
- AVOID TOUCHING YOUR FACE, especially with unwashed hands
- GET YOUR FLU SHOT

- IF YOU ARE SICK - STAY HOME & avoid contact with others
- CALL YOUR DOCTOR if you have symptoms & think you have been exposed to the virus
- COVER YOUR MOUTH & NOSE with a tissue or your sleeve when coughing or sneezing, & throw tissue in the trash
- AVOID GROUP SETTINGS AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE especially if you are age 60+ or have underlying health conditions

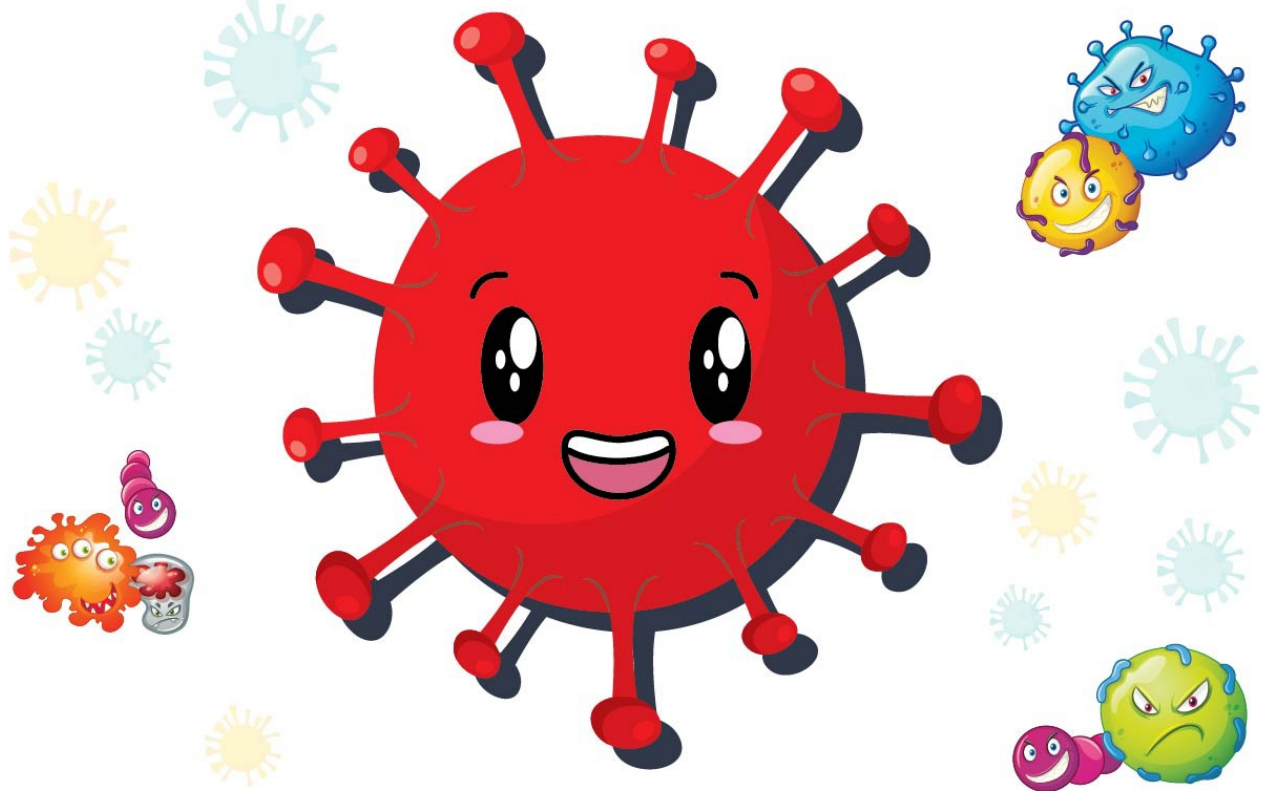

TIPS

THAT CAN HELP PREVENT THE SPREAD OF ILLNESSES, INCLUDING CORONAVIRUS*



Stay home when you are sick.

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, or cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve, not your hands. Throw your used tissue in the trash, and then wash your hands.



Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.



Avoid close contact with people who are sick.



Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

COVID-19 Guidelines on Guam

On March 14, 2020, Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero declared a State of Emergency on Guam to respond to COVID-19. Here's what this means for Guam:

Work and School:

- Until March 30, 2020, all non-essential government of Guam offices are closed and the services they offer suspended. If you are essential personnel, you will be contacted by appropriate supervisors to report to work.
- All public and private schools on Guam (pre-K through 12th grade) are closed until March 30, 2020. Student absences connected to the transmission of COVID-19 will not be counted for truancy.
- Places of business with more than 50 people in attendance shall have no more than 50% occupancy and seat no more than 50% of capacity. This does not apply to businesses providing food or necessities (e.g., grocery and convenience stores), hospitals, pharmacies, or other medical offices/facilities. This Order is not intended to prohibit routine business gatherings held at the place of business.

Social Activities:

- Gatherings of 50 people or more in a single room or single space at the same time for social, spiritual, and recreational activities are prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to: community, civic, public, leisure, faith-based, or sporting events, parades, concerts, festivals, fiestas, conventions, fundraisers, and similar activities.
- Social distancing of at least 6 feet, frequent cleaning of all services, posting signs, and permitting/encouraging teleworking are all expected.
- Older residents with pre-existing medical conditions should limit excursions away from home of any type.

Travel:

- All travelers to Guam shall be quarantined for 14 days upon arrival unless they possess a DPHSS certified document that proves they are not infected with COVID-19
- Guam residents and those with ties to the community will be permitted to self-quarantine at home if the home is deemed suitable. Otherwise, travelers will be transported to an approved quarantine site.
- EXCEPTION: ALL travelers from the Philippines who do not have a DPHSS-certified document will be transported to an approved quarantine site.
- Any and all costs associated with this quarantine and/or treatment will be the responsibility of the individual.

The Basics

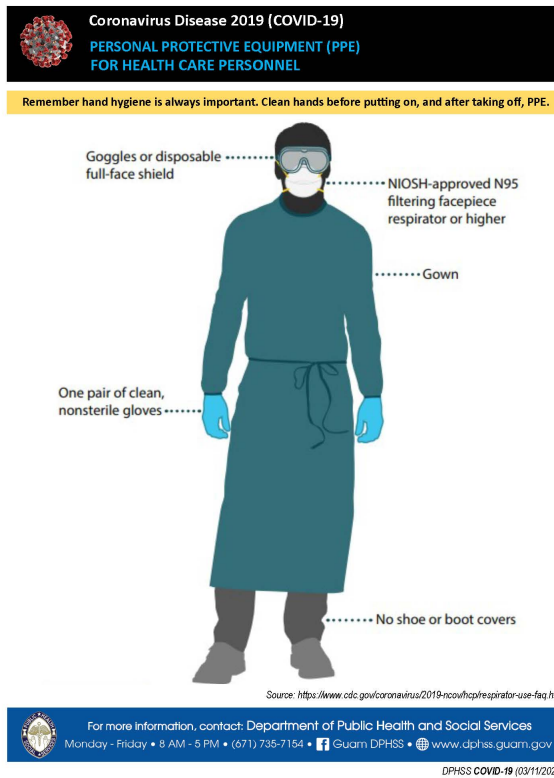
COVID-19 is a respiratory disease caused by a novel (new) coronavirus. Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that are typically found in animals, but in some instances, can infect humans and spread by person-to-person transmission, which is happening with COVID-19. Both MERS and SARS were coronaviruses that originated in bats. COVID-19 originated in Wuhan, China and the vast majority of the confirmed cases across the world are located there. Patients testing positive for COVID-19 have also been identified in 28 other countries, including the Philippines, Japan, and United States. Severity of the disease ranges from mild, cold-like symptoms to death. Continue reading for more information.
