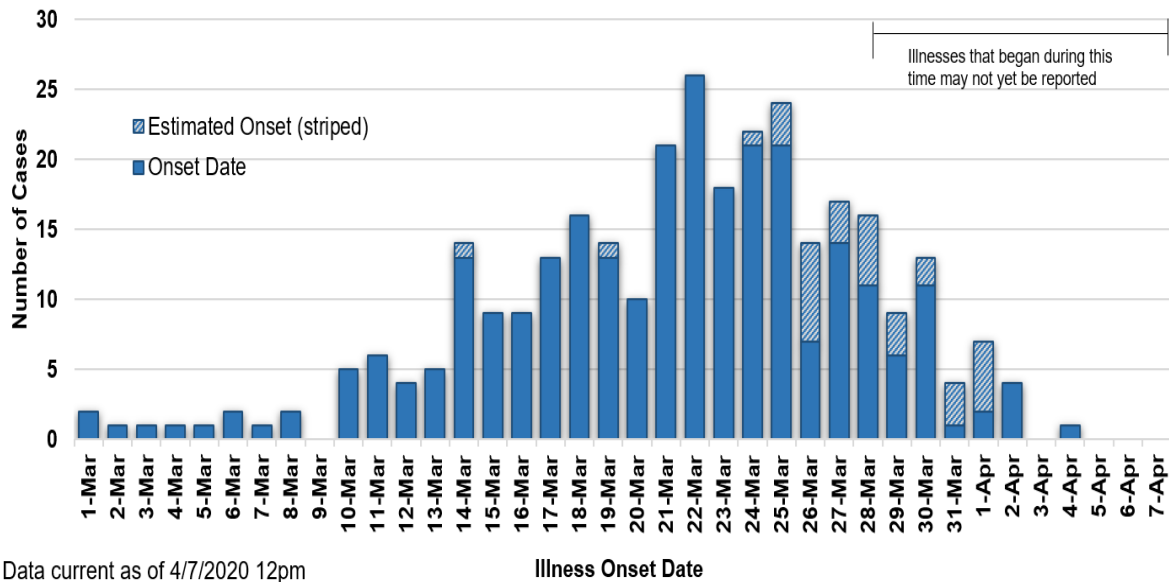
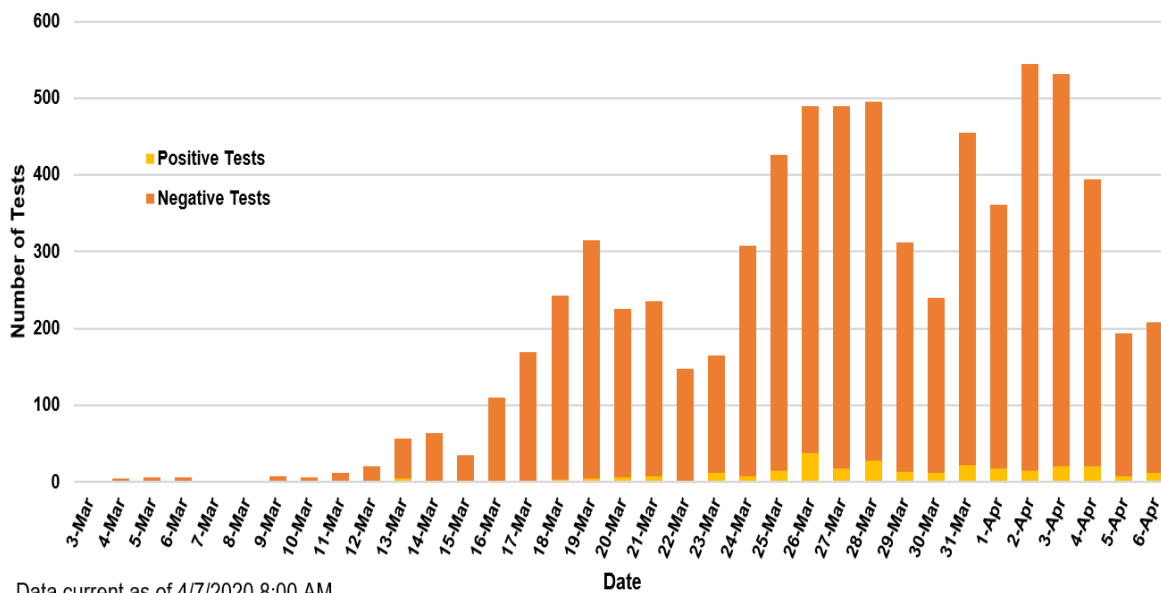




### COVID-19 Cases in Montana by Date of Illness Onset, 2020 [N=312]
