




COVID-19 Cases in Montana by Date of Illness Onset, 2020 [N=1,952]



As COVID-19 is now widespread across the United States, data no longer include out-of-state residents who test positive in Montana in order to align with Council of State and Territorial

Epidemiologists guidelines that classify cases by the individual's usual state of residence.
