The **Oregon Health Authority** (OHA) serves as the lead agency for the public health response. The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) coordinates and supports state and local recovery efforts through the Emergency Coordination Center (ECC). ECC is focused on minimizing any disruption to critical services in Oregon.


