

Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) Situation Report

Palau Ministry of Health - External Situation Report 18 April 2020 - 09:00 PWT

GLOBAL SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Ministry of Health (MOH) is closely monitoring an ongoing pandemic of a coronavirus disease which is affecting over 180 countries globally. The World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on January 30, 2020, designated its official name as Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) on February 11, 2020, and characterized it as a *pandemic* on March 12, 2020.

As of April 18, 2020:

- At least 2,240,768* confirmed cases of COVID-19 globally, including 136 in Guam, 13 in the Northern Mariana Is. (CNMI), 541 cases in Hawaii, 55 in French Polynesia, 18 in New Caledonia, 17 in Fiji, and 7 in Papua New Guinea.
- 127,595** confirmed cases within the Western Pacific Region.
- 153,871* deaths reported globally 5,558** deaths in the Western Pacific Region, 5 deaths on Guam, 9 in Hawaii, 2 in CNMI.
- **568,388*** people have **recovered** from COVID-19 globally.

PALAU READINESS AND RESPONSE

As of April 18, 2020:

- There are NO SUSPECTED or CONFIRMED CASES of COVID-19 in Palau.
- MOH Emergency Operations Center (EOC) activated on Jan. 22, 2020 to implement preparedness and response measures to minimize the risk of importation and potential local transmission of COVID-19 to Palau.
- Belau National Hospital (BNH) has reduced non-essential services and clinics and is prepared to receive and care for critically ill suspected cases.
- BNH ventilators: 2* in use, 11 available on-hand, 5 currently on order, 18 total expected capacity.
- On-island PCR testing for COVID-19 commenced on Apr. 14 for targeted priority groups including frontline workers (providers and first-responders).
- <u>COVID-19 testing (since Apr. 14)</u>: **65** tests conducted, **0** total positive, **65** total negative.
- Alternative Care Site (ACS) is currently being prepared to receive and care for critically ill suspected cases.
- MOH 24-hour COVID-19 Hotline activated for public inquiries: +680-488-0555.
- Health screening continues at Palau International Airport for chartered and private aircrafts; health screening at Malakal seaport continues for incoming vessels. Screening data:
- o Past 24 hours: 1 flights screened, 10 travelers; 0 vessels screened, 0 travelers; 10 secondary screening.
- o Since Jan. 23: 168 flights screened, 15,179 travelers; 38 vessels screened, 1,354 travelers; 337 secondary screening.
- All commercial air travel to Palau is temporary suspended as of Mar. 26 until further notice as airlines temporarily halt services. Air mail and cargo service continues on a weekly basis through chartered services.
- Executive Order No. 439 signed on Apr. 15, 2020 authorizing overtime and hazardous payment for frontline personnel involved in COVID-19 response activities.
- MOH issued a Certification of an Unavoidable Public Health Emergency for COVID-19 on Mar. 17, 2020.
- Ministry of Education issued directive on Apr. 15 extending school closures until end of school year (May 15) while mandating continued remote/online learning for students.
- The public is urged not to panic and to continue practicing public health measures to prevent respiratory infections:
 - Hand Hygiene: Frequent handwashing with soap and water or hand rub with 70% alcohol-based sanitizer.
 - Respiratory Etiquettes: Cover cough and sneeze with clean tissue or shirt sleeve.
 - Physical Distancing: Avoid close contact with others (at least 6 feet) and stay home if you are sick.
