Personal Protective Equipment Needed

Current cases: An additional 48 confirmed cases were announced Wednesday in Utah, out of slightly more than 1,000 additional tests. No new deaths have been reported. Local health departments reporting new cases included Bear River (2), Davis (4), Salt Lake (27), Southwest Utah (1 visitor), Summit (7), Tooele (1), Utah (5), and Weber-Morgan (1). Non-urgent surgeries restricted: The state is [restricting](#) non-urgent surgeries until April 25 to protect the supply of personal protective equipment such as masks and gloves.

Utah Leads Together: The Utah Leads Together economic response plan recognizes the value of facing uncertainty with a dynamic, data-informed, and unified plan. It gives structure and order, to what can otherwise be an unclear and difficult reality.

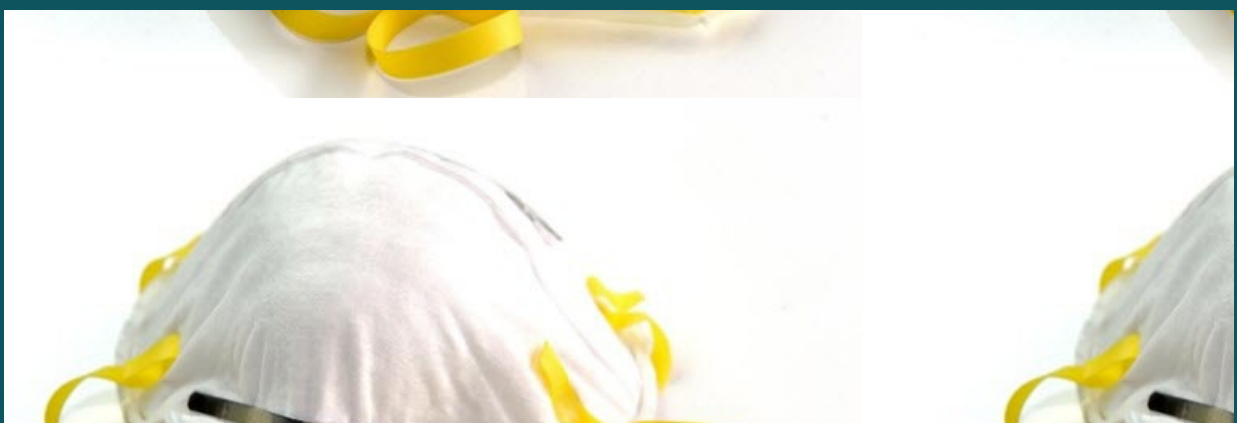
