



# Zimbabwe Covid-19 SitRep 05/10/2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS TODAY**

- 10 New Cases and No Deaths reported in the last 24 hours. (7 day rolling average\* for new cases goes up to 12 from 11 yesterday).
- 929 PCR tests done today (positivity for today was 1.1%)
- All 10 are local cases
- 65 total new recoveries reported: National Recovery rate rises to 81.3% and Active cases go down to 1246 today
- As of 5 October 2020, Zimbabwe has now recorded 7898 Cases 6424 recoveries and 228 Deaths.






- Cumulative cases curve flattening


#### **COMMENTS**

#### **Age and Sex Distribution for Cases**




#### **COMMENTS**


- Most Deaths are between 40 and 80 years of Age(68%)
- There are more deaths from males as age rises






